

## Summer skiing at Timberline

Here's a reminder of how things work at Timberline in the summer and early fall.

Most of the summer the lifts run from 7:00 am to 1:30 pm. Morning meeting is early at 6:15. You may always spend the night before at the Govy building.

We're usually off the mountain by 2 pm or so, so there's plenty of time for other things in the day. Because this schedule can change, you should always call the snow phone the day before to confirm hours.

Since crews are small in the summer, sometimes there is no hill captain scheduled. If this happens, the lowest number hill patroller takes that duty. Same thing for associate supervisor responsibilities.

Check with the pros to see what needs to be done. If you are filling in as hill captain, don't forget to fill out the green sheet and daily activ-

ity report. Forms are in the desk in the patrol room.

Send greensheets to me: 16040 SW Gage Ln, Beaverton, 97006. I'll be sure everyone gets credit for the day.

Working in the summer can be hot.

Wear layers you can remove as the day warms. It can be boilerplate in the morning, great corn for a while, then slush by closing. It's a good idea to carry your lunch and water up to the top in case things get busy--there's not always time to get inside for a real lunch.

You will want good sunglasses and sunscreen. Teflon-based wax works best, I find.

The most challenging thing about Timberline in the summer is keeping track of the changes from week to week. The location of camps, the park, and even where you can get a sled to and from changes constantly.

First thing, every time you work, take careful note of where things are, and you'll have a great day.

It's a hoot to patrol at T-Line in the summer. You get to work lots of cases, and the scenery can't be beat. The mountain looks good, too.

It is designed to develop and enhance your skills of decision making, problem management and leadership in

emergency care situations. It will also provide you with an opportunity to gain a new and different perspective on your own leadership style in those situations. And since some of the training days and the final evaluation is a combined effort between Mt. Hood Region and the Oregon Region, there's an added benefit of working in a team with patrollers from other ski areas and seeing/working with other types of equipment and supplies.

Training involves a two day clinic in January, an additional training day in February and March, ending with the final evaluation in early April. Dates will be finalized sometime in August/September and will put on the patrol calendar as soon as they are set, so stay tuned!


