Ski Patrolling Is Fun

Sustainability Committee

This summer your Sustainability Committee continued the work of previous years and began preparations for the coming year. In particular, the committee engaged in five primary activities to move our patrol into the future. First, the committee worked closely with the Council to develop and distribute a membership survey. The purpose of the survey is to gather information that will help guide the Council in the coming year as it focuses on top issues identified by the membership. The information will also guide the Sustainability Committee as it represents member interests when approaching potential contributors. The survey provides every member of our patrol with an opportunity to communicate their thoughts to the Council and committee. The membership survey was mailed on September 21 to every active member of the patrol. **Please return your survey by October 3.** If you did not receive your copy of the survey, contact Eric Einpruch to obtain one.

Second, the committee worked with the Council to identify and select Mark Sherman to help us develop a business and fundraising plan. Our goals are to establish a sustainable base to support an ongoing budget increase of \$25,000 per year and to increase the overall number of contributors by about half. Mark has extensive experience helping non-profit organizations improve their fundraising efforts. We are delighted to be working with Mark and look forward to communicating to you about our accomplishments.

Third, the committee submitted the current sustainability plan for review by both the membership and an outside reviewer. The current version of the plan was placed at Timberline, Ski Bowl, and the Gov'y Building along with feedback forms. If you have not had an opportunity to review the plan, contact Kathy Lee to obtain a copy.

Fourth, the committee began to organize documentation of patrol fundraising efforts by consolidating the list of contributors into one database. We would like to extend a special thank you to every one who has participated in fundraising for the patrol. In particular, we would like to recognize the work of the Golf Committee (the Golf Tournament has raised over \$100,000 for the capital fund over the past six years), patrollers who participate in their employer matching gifts programs, and patrollers who have participated in various events such as the Portland Area Ski Club Council Ski Fair and the Winter Ski and Sports Show.

Finally, the committee began to develop a list of members' talents and businesses into a special "yellow pages" listing.

The committee would also like to thank everyone who participated in public relations activities over the past year and in particular the work of the Public Relations Committee. The PR Committee participated in the Taste of Subaru at Portland International Raceway, Ski and Sports Show, and a Subaru spot on channel 6 entitled "Day in the life of a ski patroller." The PR Committee also created publicity about the March try-outs for the patrol.

The Sustainability Committee welcomes your help in the coming year. First, and foremost, our organization survives only by the commitment of its members and we appreciate your dedication to the patrol as demonstrated by the time you spend fulfilling your service day and training update commitments. Second, our organization thrives in relation to the value we provide to those we serve, including the skiing and snowboarding public and the areas at which they recreate, and we appreciate the positive attitude you bring to your interactions with those who you encounter on the slopes. Finally, we encourage you to get involved with the many opportunities available to serve the patrol through committee work (see the roster for a list of the committees). Together we can keep the oldest ski patrol in the nation a vibrant organization!
