Mt Hood Ski Patrol Committees

Below are some of the MHSP committees and what they do. No one should feel they are taking on the entire project or committee. Your skills or desire to learn a new skill will enrich any committee.

Banquet: Help plan the annual end of season party. Activities include invitations, decorations, location, and reviewing the script for the awards program.

By-Laws: Help update our bylaws and present proposed changes to the council and membership.

Clothing: Provides MHSP clothing and supplies. The Committee sells products at all general meetings, our annual OEC Refreshers, and other events that MHSP supports.

Computer/Systems: Help with managing the website. Volunteers need to have some computer background.

ECC (Event Catering Committee): The Event Catering Committee was founded by a group of spouses and significant others who recognized a need for managing the BBQ's following the fall chair evacuation practices. The committee is also available to manage other food related events for the Patrol. The focus of the committee is to take the burden of planning, purchasing and cooking for the events away from the patrollers and instructors, allowing them to focus on learning and instructing.

Any spouse, significant other, Host, girlfriend, boyfriend, or friend is welcome to help. An email about upcoming BBQ's is sent out on the patrol's list serve requesting volunteers and asking that members pass it on. This is a great opportunity to include your spouse, SO, etc. in a patrol activity that allows them to meet other SO's and patrollers in a fun setting.

Fundraising: Help find financial and product donations throughout the year. Review and evaluate potential new fundraising programs. Helps to coordinate on-going fundraisers excluding the Ski-Swap.

Mentor Program: Are you looking to support our newest members? Our mentor Program might be just the thing for you. Mentors help improve the transition of our newest patrollers from their apprentice training year into their rookie patrol year.

Public Relations: Help with Twitter and Facebook accounts. Review or even write press releases.

Recruitment: Committee works to bring in our new members. Arranges for members to interview potential candidates. Works with the Training Director to setup tryouts. Communicates with the candidates answering questions about MHSP. Develops ranking protocol to determine who will be offered an apprentice position on the patrol.

Ski swap: Mt. Hood Snow Sport Swap - largest fundraiser for MHSP. It is developed and managed by a steering committee composed of Committee Chairs who are responsible for publicity, vendors, finance, training of clerks and cashiers, facility, security, technology and human resources. The chairs are supported not only by their committee members, but the whole patrol as it is required that all members participate in the event. This is an excellent way to show off your particular talents besides patrolling, whether it be construction, sales, accounting, public relations, advertising or computers/software, there is always need for committee members.

Vision 2020: Working on organizational and structure changes in MHSP.

Summer Operations

Timberline

Timberline is now opening its lifts at 8:00 AM. Expect that to drop to 7:00 AM as we move into the later days of June. During the summer, patrollers should be booted up and ready to head out the door to the lowest operating lift by opening time; we do not need to show up 90 minutes early as in winter. Hill Captain or the lead (most senior) patroller for the day should contact dispatch at 8:00 AM with the number of patrollers available for duty. Once arriving on top, check in with dispatch for assignments.

Skibowl

Skibowl will begin summer operations starting with Memorial weekend and then full daily operations after June 10. Weekdays the resort will open at 11:00 AM, weekends at 10:00 AM. Since there are no opening assignments, Erich is requesting that MHSP patrollers arrive at the resort by scheduled opening, meeting in West Side First Aid Room for the day's assignments.

Summer dispatch is open so take advantage of great spring and early summer conditions. Needing extra days? There is plenty of opportunity for you to pick-up those days lost in the early season, particularly at Skibowl. So grab your skis or mountain bike and enjoy our second season.
